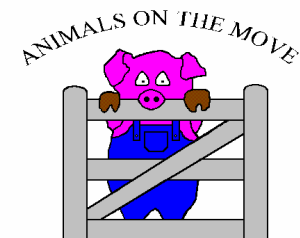

HOUSING

Animals on the Move, house our guinea pigs in enclosures that enable them to have a good run around. They are fed mainly on dry feed, hay and carrots, so any change in diet should be done gradually to avoid illness.

We have different types of recommended hutches available for sale. From single story to double deluxe, or portable on wheels.

We have found that wood shavings or sawdust is the best form of bedding. With some hay or straw for extra warmth and food. (make sure the wood shavings are not toxic).

Guinea Pigs as do rabbit suffer from extreme changes in weather. Care must be taken especially with cold weather & extreme heat.



DIET

Vitamin C is not able to be manufactured by Guinea Pigs, so a good source should always be provided daily. Guinea Pigs are herbivores and require fresh, clean vegetables and grasses daily.

All cavies, particularly pregnant sows (females), require high levels of vitamin C, which is best obtained from clean grasses or Lucerne chaff and meadow hay, this should make up the bulk of their daily diet. Supplemented by those parts of vegetables which we humans are inclined not to eat, such as carrot tops and peelings, corn husks, broccoli stalks and celery tops. Garden weeds such as milk weed and dandelions are enjoyed.

Pasture replacement pellets are available from produce stores. This should be available, **with fresh water at all times**. Bottles attached to the pen sides with a ball bearing nozzle are the best as this avoids the fouling up and tipping over of open water bowls.
